Learning Journal 6.3.15

This week we have been looking at the story of Easter. We learnt about people waving palm branches when Jesus rode into Jerusalem on a donkey and we learnt about the special meal he shared with his friends where Jesus washed his friend's feet and they broke bread and drank wine. We shared a special time together on Friday when we washed each other's hands (not feet as it takes a long time to remove and replace all our shoes and socks), then shared bread and wine (juice) as a whole school. In maths this week we looked at telling the time and all the reception children should be able to tell you the time on the hour. We were not very aware, however, of times in our daily routines. Please help your child to look at the clock and describe what time it is when the main events in their day happen, eg: getting up, going to school, eating meals, arriving home, bedtime or bath time. It is also helpful if their routine changes to point out how the time differs from the normal time for that activity. Knowing that you usually go to bed at 7 but tonight it is half past is a good way of talking about time. At school we have clock watchers who tell us when it is time to go to lunch or have milk and fruit.

In literacy we practised writing the days of the week and drawing something that happened on that day and some children were brilliant at describing what they did on different days. We also learned the new sounds ow, ay, and ee. These are harder sounds as they have two letters in them and mostly occur in the middle of words. We will continue to practice writing and reading them as we go onto the next sounds this week.

Henry came in this week to put up our new coat pegs and we took it in turns to help him. He loves to have someone working with him and we help with the pieces

of wood and the tools.

Thanks to Henry and his helpers we all have new pegs now and a lot more space to get our coats on and off.



Another magic moment this week was when a group of children decided to blow up dinosaur world using Mrs Hammond's foot pump. It was a great idea and involved a lot of discussion

and teamwork to complete the job. We were very impressed.
