Science

Learn about woodland animals, what their habitats are like and why they choose to live in those habitats.

Find out what common animals need to survive; the diets of different animals and construct basic food chains.

Plan and carry out an investigation to see which animals use an area of the woodland workshop.

English

Writing: 'What makes a sentence?' – look at use of content, capital letters and correct punctuation; begin to use a variety of sentence starters; use connectives to link ideas within sentences. Write labels, poetry, non-fiction texts and stories.

Handwriting: letter formation and joined writing.

Reading: using known sounds to decode a range of texts; comprehension too focus on retrieval; sequencing of events and understanding of the vocabulary used within a text.

Maths

Place value: count, read and write in numbers and words (Y1 to 20, Y2 to 100); recognise the place value of digits; identify, represent and estimate numbers using objects and pictorial representations; use place value to solve problems.

Addition and subtraction: Use number facts within 20; read write and interpret + - =; add and subtract using concrete objects, pictorial representations and mentally; solve problems that involve addition or subtraction; recognise the inverse relationship.

PSHE

Discuss rules and why they are important.

Find out how to keep safe, both in and out of school.

Think about how our behaviour affects others and what makes a good friend.
