Thanks to everyone for helping us get off to such a smooth, start to the new school year.

As you will already be aware, we are closed next Monday for the Queen's funeral bank holiday.

Kathy will continue to produce these regular newsletters and I will update you via Facebook. Effective communication is central to our school, please ask us if you have any questions. Please check for Parentmail emails. There is an App available from App store to make it easier to receive the communications. It is called IRIS Parentmail.

All newsletters and important texts are sent out via this method. We do not have access to your information, so you must remember to keep it up to date. Our Facebook page is used for regular reminders and links to our web site.

Time Zone and Earth Works have been given a unique chance to learn more about the Lindisfarne Gospels in Beadnell next week and will be out on Thursday 22nd September. They will need smart school uniform, a coat and sensible walking shoes.

Please remember we start school at 8.55am; the door will lock and registers will close at 9.00am and the first lesson will start then. Please don't bring children before 8.40am, as staff will not be able to supervise them.

We don't allow mobile phones in school. If your child needs to bring in their phone, to receive an important message, they must leave it in the school office. We are always happy to pass on messages and this would be a better option. Please don't allow the children to bring in Fitbits, or other expensive items, as we cannot be held responsible for their safe keeping. Smart watches with cameras are also not allowed in school, for e-safety reasons.



All money needs to be sent in to school on a Monday morning, in a clearly marked envelope, detailing what you are paying – please do not send in loose cash with a child who has just been told 'give it to Kathy', or cheques that have no indication of what they are paying! All cheques, unless advised otherwise, need to be payable to Northumberland County Council.

You are able to pay over the phone with your credit or debit card. This facility is only available on a Tuesday. If it is possible to pay by cheque, this would limit the amount of money that has to be handled by the office. In case you are unaware, the 'old style' (not made of polymer), £20.00 and £50.00 are being withdrawn from the 30th September. You can still exchange them at the bank but we can't take them as lunch money.

R – Y2 continue to have free school meals as part of the government initiative.

Lunch costs this term are £2.30 per day for Y3/4 and Nursery and, £2.60 per day for Y5 and 6 (this includes a piece of fruit at break time)

For Y3, Y4 and Early Years, the cost is £11.50 per week. £73.60 for the first half of the term, £89.70 for the second half and £163.30 for the whole term.



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For Y5 and Y6, the cost is £13.00 per week. £83.20 for the first half of the term, £101.40 for the second half and £184.60 for the whole term.

These days can change at short notice, it is a good idea to always have your PE kit in school.

Thank you to the parents who have electronically signed the annual permission slip. This is in your Parentmail accounts. Please sign as soon as possible if you have not already done so. If you are using the App to read Parentmail the link appears underlined at the top of the page (not blue!)

The electronic consent for your child's flu immunisation, is also in your inbox. This is a direct form back to NHS. The school has no way of knowing if you have consented, so please don't expect any reminders.

If you are parking at school in the back car park, please do not park, at any time of the day, where the yellow

school transport signs are displayed. (Nearest to the small gate, and the hedge that is adjacent). These spaces are

to enable school transport to operate safely. In the afternoon, once school transport has moved away, please can the parents in the back car park come into the front courtyard, through the wooden gate, to collect your children. It is very difficult to see you behind the hedge!
