Snow Closures

Thank you all for your patience with the snow closures! We have had a lot of snow where I live, but as I discovered yesterday, there are much bigger drifts nearer school with the wind coming off the coast.

Myself and my Husband ventured out to school yesterday morning, as I had a message from the biomass boiler that the hopper switch had tripped out. At the time, the forecast for Friday was not too bad, so I hoped we could get the heating back on and open the school.

that out- we had to leave the BMW, but a tractor and plough was coming towards it.

Just in time, as the driver had been stuck for 2 hours and was suffering asthma issues and refusing to leave his vehicle, tractor rescue arrived!

None of us could go forwards due to an 8ft drift ahead, so thankfully we all got turned around and able to travel on thanks to the local Farmers out ploughing in horrendous conditions. At this point, with no way forward, we decided we better just try to get home, as we were getting messages that our village was cut off.



We didn't meet anything on the A1 south of Alnwick!

Over 7 hours after we set-off, we were only a mile from home when we met a snow plough stuck in a drift at 45 degrees across the road.

We tried another route, but even an awesome Defender can't get



through some drifts, so we waited for the arrival of a local farmer and colleague to dig out a mile of road to free the plough. We all got moving, but the plough got stuck again. Luckily the JCB and Manatou could drive from behind us all, through the fields to dig for another hour to free the plough again.

I am pleased to say that, despite our failure yesterday, the heating is back on today- thanks to Mrs Williams. Hooray!
