Important update re school day timings:

In order to increase our school week to 32.5 hours, in line with new Government legislation, (from the summer term) our school day will begin at 8.45am and end at 3.15pm. This is possible from the summer term, as the school transport contracts are being reissued then. In order to make it easier for families of nursery aged pupils, we will not charge for this additional time and pick-up/drop-off will match that of older pupils. After School clubs will continue until 4.15pm.



Lunch costs this term will be as follows:

For Y3, Y4 and Early Years the cost is £2.30 per day; £11.50 per week; £69.00 for the first half of the term; £57.50 for the second half and £126.50 for the whole term.

For Y5 and Y6, the cost is £2.60 per day; £13.00 per week; £78.00 for the first half of the term; £65.00 for the second half and £143.00 for the whole term.

Payments can be made over the phone on a Tuesday, after 9.30 am, or a cheque sent at any time.

We are continuing to take cash, but if at all possible, we would prefer a cheque or a telephone payment. Cash needs to be sent in to school on a Monday morning, in a clearly marked envelope, detailing what you are paying.

We continue to run a well-attended After School club each night until 4.00pm. There are still spaces available for all the clubs. It is also usually possible to arrange short notice, ad hoc sessions if you suddenly need additional child care. Sports clubs cost £2.50 an hour (subsidised with our government PE grant), Music, Forest Craft and Film club £5.00 an hour.

We are celebrating Red Nose Day on Friday 17th March. We plan to have Red Noses for sale prior to the date and we will be holding a non-uniform day and collecting donations. Wear something red, if you have it, and take part in some of the challenges that will be held in school. We will let you know when Red Noses are available.

As mentioned on Facebook, we now have a Clothes Bank in school. You can donate clothes, shoes (pairs), hats, belts, jewellery etc. Everything needs to be put in a bag and dropped into the bin. This is a very easy way to fundraise for school and look after our planet at the same time. Since the introduction of the Clothes Bank we have raised over £200.

It seems likely that the weather will remain very cold. Please make sure your child has a warm waterproof coat, hat and gloves in school.
