Mathematics

In maths we are learning solid shapes and recognising cube, cuboid, sphere, cylinder and cone. We sorted these shapes and looked at how well they can roll or slide. We will be continuing with this work next week, so if you have boxes or toys at home try to identify what shape they are. We are also continuing our work on subtraction by finding the difference between two numbers. Literacy and Phonics
