We continue to run a well-attended After School Club each night until 4.00pm. There are still spaces available for all the clubs. It is also usually possible to arrange short notice, ad hoc sessions if you suddenly need additional child care. Sports clubs cost £2.50 an hour (subsidised with our government PE grant), Music, Forest Craft and Film club £5.00 an hour.

Always bring a coat. Don't forget swimming on Friday for Earthworks. Please stay away from school for 48 hours if you have been sick or have diarrhoea.



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
On Thursday 30<sup>th</sup> of March there will be a Eucharist service at Ellingham Church at 9.30 am. Everyone is welcome.
