<p>Children are taught to: Develop their vocabulary as they encounter new experiences and objects Speak to adults, groups of children and their friends and listen to the thoughts and opinions of others. Listen attentively and remember and follow spoken advice or instructions.</p>	<p>Children are taught to: Develop large motor skills and build muscle strength and stamina in lots of outdoor learning and physical activity. Manage dressing and undressing and their own personal hygiene. Use small motor skills to use pencils, pens, scissors, paint brushes, cutlery etc. effectively and with control. Be able to make healthy choices and keep themselves safe.</p>	<p>Children are taught to: Become confident in school to come in happily; explore new things; explain how they are feeling, and ask for help when they need it. Think about others, make friends and play together. Form good relationships with children and adults. Adapt their behaviour to school rules and routines and know how to work as a group or class.</p>	<p>Children are taught to: Recognise and use the technology around them. Know the uses of technology in the home and school and be able to use age appropriate equipment in the classroom.</p>	<p>Children are taught to: Sing songs and play music as a form of self expression, and enjoy performing for an audience. Move to music and in play in a way which expresses feeling and explore ways of changing movements. Explore tools, techniques and materials to create their own pieces of work using colour, texture, and shape to explore their own designs. Play imaginatively and have time and space to explore their own imaginations.</p>
