## Literacy and Phonics

## Mathematics

We were working on addition this week, counting on in our heads and on our fingers, and using counting equipment. The younger children were matching numbers to numerals and ordering numbers to 10 using jigsaws and a variety of number games. They have also been practising using their fingers to show a number and enjoy our finger races very much.

Other news.....we have been working very hard in our garden to fill our raised beds and get ready for the spring. We have had some fantastic compost from our bins and have loved digging in the mud and wheelbarrowing it all to the top of the field. Hopefully we will be able to grow some delicious fruit and veg in them. As a reward for their hard work the children had hot chocolate which we made using the storm kettle and then we roasted marshmallows on the fire.
