## Literacy and Phonics

We are still learning letter names as well as sounds and are remembering lots more now. Our nursery children have finished their Talk Boost programme with 'Jake and Tizzy' and will be going on to some structured phonics sessions in preparation for Reception in September. We are all thinking about story language and how to use it in our play and our writing. The only way to learn this is to read lots and lots of stories!

## Mathematics

Our maths has covered a range of different skills, including addition, problem solving, halves and quarters, counting to 20 and beyond and looking at number patterns.

The reception children are also learning to estimate how many objects are in a group and adjust their estimation to make it more accurate. They are really good at this and have practised hard this week.

Only turn the DVD player on when your children have exhausted all the other possibilities and consider story CDs where children use their imagination instead of DVDs where the pictures are there for them.
