Staffing

Curriculum

We are currently redesigning the creative curriculum. Our HMI inspector was very enthusiastic about our plans. We will no longer have a four-year rolling programme for the whole school, but will have a two-year programme for each Key Stage. We will maintain our 'enquiry-based' curriculum - which she saw as a strength- focusing on developing the pupils' skills in researching, and answering key questions, with the main focus on knowledge and understanding of the world around them. More detailed information will follow during this long-term project.

For the Spring Term, the topics and key questions will be:

Splash: People and Places (Living long ago and what is life like around the World?)

Space Base: Who were the Victorians? (Find out about jobs children did)

Earth Works: Who were the Greeks? (Find out about Greek myths and legends)

Time Zone: Who were the Mayans and where did they live?

Any holiday research, of the appropriate topic, would be much appreciated and the pupils can present their research in any way they like, on their return in January.
