It seems likely that the weather is to get very cold again. Please make sure your child has a warm waterproof coat, hat and gloves in school. In the event of school bad weather closure, information will be sent by text, and will be on the school and NCC website, Radio Newcastle and the school Facebook page.

Please make sure your PMX Parentmail details are correct. If you have recently changed your mobile number we cannot update your details for you. Texts will be sent out in an emergency so please double check if you are not sure.

Lunch costs this term will be as follows:

For Y3, Y4 and Early Years the cost is £2.30 per day, £11.50 per week. £78.20 for the first half of the term, £69.00 for the second half and £147.20 for the whole term.

For Y5 and Y6 the cost is £2.60 per day, £13.00 per week. £88.40 for the first half of the term, £78.00 for the second half and £166.40 for the whole term.

All money needs to be sent in to school on a Monday morning, in a clearly marked envelope, detailing what you are paying. All cheques, unless advised otherwise, need to be payable to Northumberland County Council. Telephone card payments can be made on Tuesdays.



Milk this term, will be charged retrospectively at the end of the term. Some Reception children will turn 5 this term, and will be charged unless you have spoken to Kathy. Any child who paid for milk last term will be charged again this term,

Y3 – 4 are swimming this term. There will be a total of 13 swimming lessons this term at a cost of £4.00 per session, £52.00 for the term.



No earrings are permitted for PE or swimming. Please make sure your child can take their earrings out themselves. A number of pupils have now mastered this. If you are allowing your child to have pierced ears,

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please take it into consideration that they need to be able to do this after the 6 week period. If they have only just been pierced, please speak to Kathy, if you have not already done so.

Earth Works will still swim on this afternoon.

We also continue to be a drop off point for the Alnwick Food Bank. They are currently short of pasta sauces, tinned meats and fish, tinned puddings like
