We can't believe it is nearly the end of term!

Organisation

Thank you very much to everyone who attended a meeting about my organisational plans for Years 3/4/5/and 6 next year; these were well supported.

For those not there, as we will have a bulge of pupils in upper Key Stage 2 next year (31 in Time Zone), the plan is to use staffing flexibly, in order to support pupils in smaller groups. For example, Y6 and Y 5 pupils will be split over two groups for maths and English in the Autumn term. The two year topic curriculum will be maintained, so they will be taught as 3/4 and 5/6 for this, but with additional support as needed. In the Spring Term, Year 6 will be taught more as a separate group, in order to help them prepare for Sats.

Ongoing pupil assessment will inform how pupils are grouped in the core subjects.

The staff teaching in KS2 will be: Miss Baines, Mrs Lakey, Mrs Stapleton, Mrs Dodds, Miss Foster (Student Teacher), Mrs Lester and Miss Pringle. This will be an excellent staff to pupil ratio in order to support the larger pupil numbers.

Year 6 Leavers

Well done to our Year 6s for ending the school year so positively and maturely. It has been a pleasure having them as our first Year 6 pupils. Their behaviour has been outstanding and they have represented us so well at a host of events throughout the year, including on Friday at the beach transition day with Shilbottle school and at Newcastle Cathedral.

Request

Maths Research Hub

A few months ago, Mrs Stapleton put a bid forward for us to be part of a maths research hub. This was successful and Miss Baines, Mrs Stapleton and I attended a launch event with schools across the north east. This is a two year project which we believe will strengthen our delivery of the maths mastery curriculum and enable us to analyse the impact of developments in this subject, especially with regard to mixed-age teaching. Mrs Stapleton will lead this project in school, which will support her National Professional Qualification in School Leadership.
