



Primary School Sport Premium Funding 2020/21

Under the Primary School Sport Funding initiative, in the 2020/21 academic year, we will receive £16,569 in order to enhance PE and sport in our school. Due to the cancellation of events last academic year (Covid-19), there is a carry forward of £3,367. The total for this academic year will be: £19,936

We will target funds and monitor impact by:

- enhancing the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision for children;
- promoting pupil activity, health and well-being;
- participation and success in competitive school sport;
- meeting the inclusion requirements and the value for money criteria which will be set by Ofsted.

Pupils are enthusiastic and fully engaged with these 'Missions', gaining self-confidence, resilience and team work skills. This has been of particular value following partial school closures and the impacts on pupil wellbeing and reduction in social interaction.
