## Covid-19 Update

Our updated Risk Assessment and Contingency Plan is on the school website.

The staff have agreed to maintain the current system of measures, rather than return to stricter bubbles, as both the pupils and staff have benefitted from having greater normality. As per the Contingency Plan, if we have any in-school cases, then we will bring back staged, restrictive measures, in-line with the number of cases and Public Health England advice.

Unfortunately, the updated NCC guidance means we will not be able to hold any largescale audience events, such as the Nativity. I am, however, hoping that several school visits can still take place, following careful risk assessment by ourselves and venues, and with agreement from NCC. So, as long as we have no cases prior to visits, such as Robinwood, these should be able to take place. We do need you to be vigilant for symptoms and let us know about any close contact cases.

## Clothing

Please can you provide your child/children with some extra, warm layers, such as thermals or an extra fleece, as we have to increase ventilation with windows open and it is harder to maintain temperatures when the weather is now getting much colder. Putting coats on indoors often restricts movement for writing etc. and if they have got damp outdoors, this is less comfortable too.
